SERMON NOTES

"Speaking God's Language"
1 Corinthians 14:1-25

Summary: The coming of Jesus began a new era of history where the message of salvation is now explicitly for all nations and languages. The church's mission is to continue proclaiming that message until Jesus returns.

Four Presuppositions about Tongues (Cards on the Table)

New Testament tongues were:

- Revelatory
- Foreign Languages
- Intended for the Public
- o Sign of a Shift in Redemptive History
- Four Sections of the Text (Feet in the Bible)

Paul is telling the Corinthians that:

- o Love is (Still) the Guiding Principle (v.1-5)
- o Speech is Meant for Understanding (v.6-12)
- o The Better is Worth Pursuing (v.13-20)
- o The Stakes are Blessing and Judgement (v.21-25)
